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Grant Opportunities

Below is a summary of the programmes we fund for young people. Being a member of the Jack Petchey Achievement Award Scheme gives you access to a wide range of free and subsidised programmes to support your young people.

The Jack Petchey Achievement Award Scheme

Our flagship programme, the Jack Petchey Achievement Award Scheme, recognises outstanding young people ages 11-25 across London and Essex. This grant programme recognises young people for their achievements with a certificate, pin badge and a £300 grant. The young person decides how to spend this grant in a way that benefits other young people at their youth group, school or college. Winners are also presented with a medallion at one of our Achievement Award Events. Applications can be submitted at any time. Apply online or contact your Jack Petchey Foundation Grants Officer.



Environmental Award and Grant

This award and grant recognises young people for their work in supporting awareness of climate and sustainability issues. One young person, per scheme, per calendar year can be nominated. Applications can be submitted via our Community Area.



Educational Visits Grants

These grants support schools and youth organisations with the costs of making trips to museums, theatres and more. We'll cover the transport costs/entrance fees up to £20 per young person, with a total of £1,200 available per trip. You can apply for two Educational Visits per calendar year. Special Needs groups/schools, Pupil Referral Units and Alternative Education Provisions can apply for up to £60 per person for day trips and up to £100 per person for Residential. Staff costs will be considered for these groups. Applications can be submitted at any time via our Community Area.



Leader Award

The Leader Award Scheme highlights and recognises the commitment of adults who work with schools and youth organisations to support young people. Organisations can nominate one adult leader per year. Once approved, the Leader Award Winner is eligible to apply for a Leader Award Grant. Applications can be submitted at any time via the Community Area.



Leader Award Grants

The Leader Award Grant allows organisations that have successfully applied for a Leader Award to apply for a grant of up to £1,000 to further enhance their work with young people. Organisations are eligible if they have applied for, and received, a Leader Award in the past six months. Apply via the Community Area.



Partnership Programmes

We partner with various organisations to help deliver programmes for young people, giving them opportunities in many different areas. From singing to maths, oracy to wallball, there's something for everyone!

Jack Petchey's Speak Out Challenge!

Theme: Oracy

Jack Petchey's Speak Out Challenge! is the largest speaking competition for young people in the world. It provides essential tools for young people to communicate effectively and with purpose. We offer free and subsidised full day public speaking workshops for Year 10 students in every state school in London and Essex. The programme also provides a showcase through school assemblies, Regional Finals and Grand Final events.

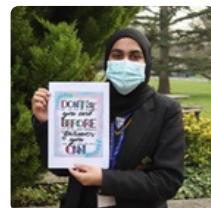


Table Tennis Programme

Theme: Social Action

This programme is designed to improve sixth form students' understanding of personal finance and put them in a position where they can make positive decisions on money after they leave school. Students in Year 12 and 13 can receive 60-75 minute tuition sessions delivered over 4 workshops, covering crucial topics such as budgeting, credit cards and student finance. Talk About The Future is an oracy programme designed to support Year 12 students in preparing to leave school by developing their speaking skills to support their interview technique, presentation skills and boosting their self-esteem. All this and more is covered in a full day, in-school workshop, building their confidence, resilience and positive mindset.

Talk About Transition is a half-day confident communication workshop aimed at students in the first term of Year 7. The workshop engages students using oracy based activities and strategies to develop self-confidence and resilience to support a successful transition from primary to secondary school.
